GUIDELINES FOR LIBRARY BEHAVIOR

The Auburn University Libraries seeks to provide for its users:

- **Library materials, in particular, journals, federal documents, and books that are complete and unmarked.**
- **Access to these materials through an on-line catalog, as well as access to other materials available electronically.**
- **A place suitable for reading, study, and research in support of Auburn's institutional goals, in particular, a place free from excessive noise and problems caused by food, beverages and other damaging substances including liquid spilled on computer equipment.**

The following behaviors are contrary to the goals cited above:

- **Modifying or damaging equipment located in the Library, including but not limited to computers.**
- **Removing or attempting to remove Library materials, equipment, or any other University property without proper authority.**
- **Mutilating Library materials by marking, underlining, removing pages or portions of pages, removing bindings, removing electronic theft devices, or in any way damaging or defacing library materials.**
- **Engaging in any behavior which disturbs the normal patterns of library activities, (i.e., excessive noise, any form of patron harassment)**
- **Smoking or using tobacco products in the Library.**

Any Libraries user who is observed engaging in any of the inappropriate acts cited above will immediately be:

- **Asked to leave the Library**
- **Reported to the police with possible legal action**
- **Reported to the Auburn University Student Disciplinary Committee**
