The Library has a collection of over 12,000 music scores, 15,000 books about music, 2,000 CDs, and 5,000 LPs. The scores and books are located on the 3rd floor of the library and the recordings (along with DVDs and videos) are in the newly-expanded Media and Digital Resource Laboratory on the 1st floor.

Music Databases

All databases are available over the Internet. To access databases off-campus, you'll need to log in with your user name and password.

Music Index Online

An index to hundreds of international music periodicals from 1973 to the present.

Grove Music Online

The New Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians, The New Grove Dictionary of Opera, and The New Grove Dictionary of Jazz are now online.

Naxos Music Library and Naxos Music Library Jazz

The Naxos Music Library databases provide online collections of classical, jazz, and world music streaming audio available over the internet.

Music Services and Resources

Media and Digital Resource Laboratory

The MDRL, located on the 1st floor of the library, provides state-of-the-art equipment, software, and consulting services to students, faculty, and staff. The Lab provides facilities and instruction for audio and video editing, graphics layout and design, scanning, and many other digital projects. For music, software includes Adobe Audition, Finale, Apple Garage Band '08, and Apple Soundtrack Pro 2. **New this fall**, CDs, DVDs, videos, and audiobooks will be located in the lab.

[AUBIExpress](#)

By using AubiExpress, you can request book chapters, scores, and journal articles owned by Auburn Libraries be delivered to you electronically. Most materials arrive within 48 hours.

[Interlibrary Loan](#)

To obtain materials not owned by Auburn Libraries, use Interlibrary Loan. You can borrow books, scores, DVDs, and recordings from other libraries by filling out a form online. Although many materials come within a few days, allow two weeks for items to arrive.

[Renew Books](#)

Check your library record and renew books, CDs, DVDs, and scores online.

[Courier Service](#)

Fill out a request online to have library materials (books, scores, CDs, DVDs, LPs) delivered to your office.

[Paper and Electronic Reserves](#)

You can place supplementary class materials on reserve at the library's circulation desk either in hard copy or electronic format. Books, scores, articles, or tests can be converted to electronic format and viewed by any student with Internet access. The material will be password protected to ensure compliance with copyright provisions. For more information, contact elersv@auburn.edu
